




Fook part in a first aid course where they gained certificates in level 3 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work. They had a fantastic day and learnt essential skills for their future careers.

T-LEVELS

Our first cohort of year 13 Digital T Level students have successfully completed a 9 week Industry Placement with JP Morgan and Telesoft.

We are incredibly proud of the success that our students have had whilst on placement. Our students have had an opportunity to learn new skills and apply the classroom learning into practice in a real-life work environment.

Feedback from both placements has been excellent; student behaviours and technical understanding have exceeded the expectations of employers.

Taking part in a T Level Industry Placement provides our students with a chance to build a relationship early on with a local employer and offers a career pathway for our students.

Both JP Morgan and Telesoft offer Digital and Technology Degree Apprenticeships, for which many of our T Level students have already applied.



U14 County Netball Tournament



Well done to our amazing Year 9 netball team who played some fantastic competitive netball at the County round of the U14 competition on Thursday 23rd November. In the first round, earlier in the month, the girls came 3rd in the PEDSSA tournament, thereby securing their place in the county finals.

The matches at Canford School were tough, they were fast paced and exciting to watch. Our girls managed to keep their cool and play some superb netball. They showed determination and perseverance but above all, a strong sense of teamwork. Despite coming 8th overall out of 12 teams from across the Dorset area, they never gave up or dropped their enthusiasm. Well done to our captain, Amy for leading the team brilliantly and to Emma, Annabel, Grace, Layla, Belle, Kim and Evie for playing. And finally, Mrs Pemberton for coaching.



6th Form Sailing Course

- PE Students embarked on a sailing trip on the 4th of October. Two Y13 students, Charlotte Andrews and Abi Middleton, who took park on the trip, account the events that took place and share their experiences:
- "On day 1, we learnt the basic components within the structure of the boat. We then learnt some processes of how to rig the boat, how to sail at beam reach (across the wind) and how to tack. Due to a lack of experience in the group, there was a lot of capsizing when tacking which meant we were able to laugh at ourselves and accept our failures whilst also learning along the way. It was important that we worked in a team, since one person was in charge of the speed of the boat, whilst the other had the important job of steering. Communication was also vital as there was a large metal pole, the boom, which swung at head height every time you changed direction. This meant that it was imperative to communicate in our pairs to ensure everyone was safe and reduce the risk of injury."
- "On day 2, we recapped what we did the day before, and were then taught how to sail up and down wind. This proved to be a challenge to most of the group as we kept turning to face the wind and going into the 'no go zone', meaning we stopped moving. It was difficult to get out of this situation without help from the staff. In order to pass the course, we had to complete a circuit which involved sailing upwind at beam reach and then down wind. Not many of us were able to complete this in the morning but in the afternoon, everyone was able to do it after some valuable input from Andy Straw."
- "This course allowed us all to learn and improve skills such as communication, teamwork, perseverance, and determination. It also allowed us to get better at prioritising tasks with a higher importance, ensuring we completed the task at hand successfully."





We are delighted that 51 students from year 10 are signed up to complete the bronze Duke of Edinburgh award this academic year. The students are busy starting their three sections for skills, physical and volunteering.

After school sessions have started to help the student to gain all the skills they need to be successful in the expedition section. They are currently studying map reading skills and will be starting their first aid course on Monday 4th December 2023.

For our final Christmas treat the students made a 'chemistree' a Christmas tree made from multi-coloured solutions.








Biology in Action


On 10th November 40 students from sixth form and Year 11 attended Biology in Action to learn about different aspects of biology.

• This academic year has started well for the Jon Egging Trust at Ferndown Upper School. There are two cohorts – Blue Skies 3 group, now in their 3rd year. They are focusing on employability skills this year and have enjoyed three sessions since September. Firstly, a refresher at school and then a visit by apprentices from QinetiQ. Three apprentices came to chat with the group about how apprenticeships work.

• They have recently had a visit to NATS at Swanwick and learnt that all the aircraft flying over the UK are controlled by Air Traffic Controllers working at Swanwick. It was a brilliant day – really good fun and educational. Students learnt lots of life skills and chatted to Degree Entry Graduates who told them about their career paths.

• The second JET cohort are on the Blue Skies 2 programme. They are learning what it takes to be a leader and they have looked at different styles of leadership. They have had a visit to Draken at Bournemouth Airport. They interviewed the Vice President of the company and were able to get into a Falcon aircraft which was very exciting.

Foundation Residential to London








The students also had a once in a life time chance to see the retrospective exhibition of Marina Abramovic's powerful performance art, both shocking and poetic in equal measure.

- Both students and staff who took part got a glimpse of what life on the streets can be like and were inspired to do more for those less fortunate in their local area.

Here is how one student, Y12 Phoebe Coombs, recounted the event:

"The big sleep involved students creating their own areas to sleep outside during the night, we were supplied with cardboard and tarpaulin from the YMCA to create these. Students helped each other create these shelters to sleep in overnight, most of us just having a sleeping bag for warmth. We were kindly given pizza and snacks to keep us going for the night and, although we had to sleep rough, we all enjoyed ourselves."
