Ashton House is named after an ex-student who studied physics at university, completing a PhD in gravitational waves, tiny ripples in the fabric of spacetime created when black holes collide. When he began his PhD, these gravitational waves had not yet been directly observed but in September 2015, the LIGO detectors made the first detection, and he was co-author of the paper. This was a watershed moment for astronomy and won the founders of LIGO the Nobel prize in 2017. He is now a Lecturer at Royal Holloway, University of London, where he divides his time leading the LIGO collaboration's working group that finds black hole collisions and teaching
