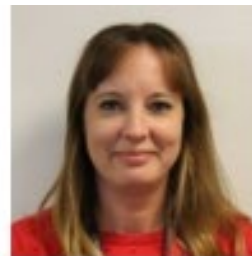

### **DfE Performance Tables confirm outstanding results for a third year in a row at Ferndown Upper School**

After receiving the highest results in Dorset for the last two years (combined GCSE Progress 8, A Level and Applied General value added scores), Ferndown Upper students achieved another outstanding set of results last summer, which now makes it three years in a row.

For GCSE, the school's Progress 8 result is +0.63, (every grade being 2/3 of a grade better than expected), which makes Ferndown

Upper School the highest achieving school in Dorset ever (since the DfE started using Progress 8 as a measure).

This result means that Ferndown is not only the highest achieving school in Dorset but it is the highest achieving upper school in the country and in the top 5% of all schools. Along with the best overall GCSE results in Dorset, the performance tables also confirm

that Ferndown Upper's students':

- Maths results were the highest in Dorset
- Science results were the second best
- English results were the third best.

This made it a truly outstanding year of achievement.

In terms of A Level results, Ferndown Upper students achieved a value added score of +0.23

(results that were 23% better than predicted), and this was the second highest result in Dorset and in the top 10% of the country.

This makes Ferndown Upper School the school of choice for academic achievement.

Some of the subjects that were singled out for specific praise by the charity Alps were sociology, maths and further maths whose results were in the top 1% of the country, as well as art and textiles, whose results were in the top 5%.

Headteacher Philip Jones stated, "I am very proud of our students, these results belong to

them, I would also like to thank our teachers for all of their hard work and dedication. It is now clear to see that if students wish to maximise their grades, we are the school to choose. I would also like to add that Ferndown is not just about exam results, we also pride ourselves on being an extremely supportive, friendly and nurturing school, where students are allowed to be whoever they want to be and where students always come first."

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# Uniform

The embroidered blouse, tie and PE Kit is available in your House colour.

New uniform has our new logo - but you can mix and match the new and old logo. A 30% discount is available on uniform that has the old logo.

## SCHOOL UNIFORM

**Make Up:** Discreet natural make-up only - excessive make-up will be asked to be removed. This includes false eyelashes.

**Nails:** No false nails (these are a health and safety risk for PE and practical subjects) and nails should only be painted in natural colours.

**Jewellery:** No jewellery other than - 1 fine neck chain, 1 ring, 1 watch, 1 plain gold/silver stud in each ear, one plain nose stud (less than 1mm), one small bracelet, one charity wrist-band. No other visible pierced jewellery and definitely **no spacers or nose bars**.

**School tie:** in House colour (sold at The School Shop and the School) worn to correct length. With house colour stripe visible.

**Shirt:** Plain white school shirt with collar buttoned to top (not sports or casual shirts.)

**Sweater:** Plain black knitted long sleeved 'V' neck sweater (standard length) (winter wear in Autumn and Spring Terms only, worn under blazers not instead of a blazer.)

### JEWELLERY

One fine neck chain, one ring, one watch, one plain gold/silver stud in each ear, one plain nose stud-less than 1mm, one small bracelet, one charity wristband. No other visible pierced jewellery, spacers or nose bars.

### ACCESSORIES

Belts must be plain black, with no logo and no wider than 3cm. No scarves or hats/headwear.

### COATS

Suitable for bad weather, are worn on top of blazers, not instead of. Coats are not to be worn inside. No denim or hoodies.

### HAIR

A uniform natural hair colour. No shaved heads, patterns or hair tattoos.  
Two tone hair, growing out of one natural hair colour to another, is only acceptable in the short term. Hair should not be dyed unnatural colours or two tone colour.

### MAKE UP & NAILS

Discreet natural make-up only - you will be asked to remove excessive makeup. This includes false eyelashes. No false nails, these are a health and safety risk. Nails should only be painted in natural colours. Please see our additional guidance on lashes and nails.

### SHOES

**Hair:** A uniform natural hair colour. No inappropriate hair accessories/designs, **no unnatural hair colours**. No shaved heads, markings or hair tattoos.

**Two-tone hair:** Where hair is a natural colour (naturally or not) and growing out back to a natural colour is acceptable in short term. Students will either grow the colour out (and support this with haircuts where / when possible) or they will dye it to be one natural colour. Students should not choose to dye their hair an un-natural colour / two tone colour.

**Coats:** (Suitable for bad weather) are worn on top of blazers, not instead of and not to be worn in class rooms.

**Please note the following, which relates to all students:** No scarves, No denim jackets or coats, sports or tracksuit tops, 'hoodies' etc. No baseball caps or other headgear.

**SKIRT:** Pleated black knee length school skirt only available from The School Shop.

**Trousers:** Plain black **tailored** full length school trousers which must not be skin tight (**NOT** 5 pocket jeans or jean style, calf length, tight fitting, low cut at the waist, or with any visible badges, motifs, zips or fasteners, 'fashion' trousers, leggings, lycra based fabrics, hipster style or skinny jeans). **The test we use in school is whether the trouser clings to the knee or below the knee. If it does cling to the knee or below these trousers will not be accepted.**

**Socks:** Plain socks (black or grey), tights must be natural or black. Not white or trainer socks.

**NB.** Inappropriate items of clothing (especially 'hoodies', scarves and jewellery) will be confiscated if worn in school.

We run a daily Withdrawal Room - if a student is disrupting learning and have not responded to the warning / support - they are sent to work in our withdrawal room.

This is for the rest of the day, leaving 5 minutes later than other students (they can still catch the bus).

In the room, we work with the student to reflect on how they could have behaved differently.

Students who regularly are sent to Withdrawal Room move onto Behaviour Support Plans .

### Subjects studied in September to May in Year 9

Art & Design, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computing, Drama, design & Technology, English, French or Spanish, Geography, History, Maths, PE, Ethics, PHSE and Textiles.

No other local school offers this broad range of subjects to Year 9 students

### Setting and Mixed Ability Teaching

Students in Year 9 are set by ability in Maths, Physics, Chemistry and Biology and then selected by language choice (French or Spanish) then taught in mixed ability groups for all other subjects. They will be set by ability in English as well from the start of Year 10.

### **Triple Science for all**

All students study for three separate science subjects- Chemistry, Physics and Biology.

We are one of only a handful state non-grammar secondary schools who offer this.

### **GCSE Options Courses**

These start after May Half Term 2025. We offer a full range of GCSE and equivalent vocational courses. The process for option choices starts in January 2025. Students get to select four options courses along with English Literature, English Language, Maths, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

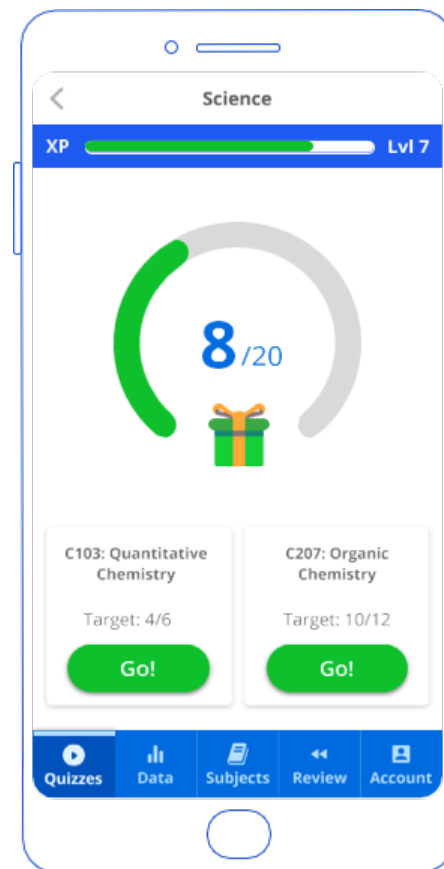

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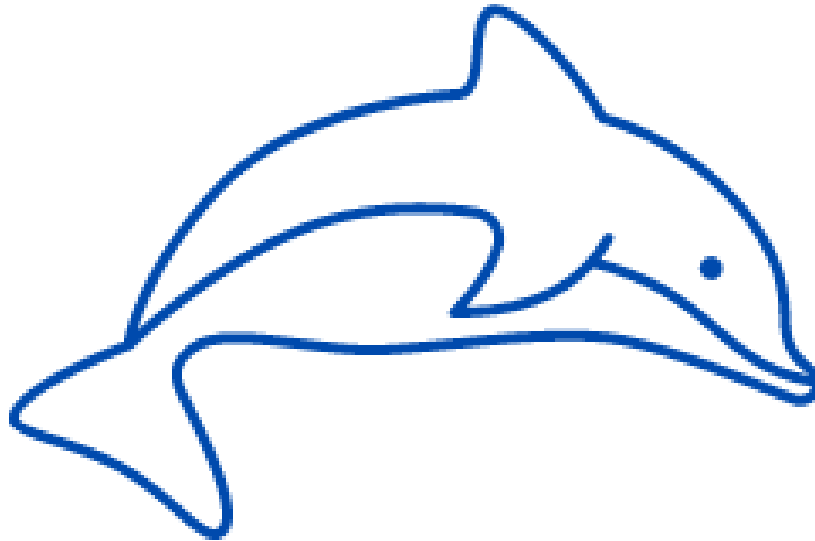

## Other queries

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Cashless Payment system in the café - fingerprints/fobs/contactless e.g. card or phone payment.
